

Steps to celebrating a Holy Hour for Vocations

1. Gauge interest from your local Knights
 - a. Decide if the Council wishes to keep this a Knights only Holy Hour
 - b. Decide if the Council wishes to open this Holy Hour up to the parish at large
2. Approach your Pastor or Chaplain about this idea
 - a. A priest or deacon is required to have Exposition and Benediction to start and end the Holy Hour
 - b. Inform the Priest of your desire to host a Holy Hour for Vocations
 - c. Show him the plan for the Holy Hour (included in this letter)
 - d. Explain to the Priest that all he needs to do is set a date/time that would work for him and show up
 - i. The Council should do all organization of this event, so the Pastor does not feel that this is an extra thing added to his "list"
 - ii. The Council should organize readers, servers (if desired), and any communications to the parish at large to advertise this Holy Hour
3. Four – Five weeks in advance of the Holy Hour (after the priest has given the date/time that works for him), submit a bulletin announcement
 - a. This will ensure that the bulletin advertises this Holy Hour for at least three weeks prior to the event
 - b. Ask the Pastor if he would be willing to announce the Holy Hour at the weekend Masses
4. Two – Three weeks in advance of the Holy Hour, get commitments from brother Knights to act as Lectors and servers (or young men from the parish to serve if desired)
